## Of the Father's Love Begotten

You know you're getting a little long in the tooth when you remember when "In case of emergency, break glass" was not a meme, but a pretty commonly



appearing sign in public buildings. I certainly remember seeing fire extinguishers mounted behind glass in a cabinet, with the little hammer hanging below on its brass chain. Although if you look on Pinterest you will see everything from Hershey bars to single malt Scotch packaged with the instruction to break glass in case of emergency, it is reassuring to know that you can still buy a non-metaphorical fire extinguisher behind break-away glass.

Sometimes, we preacher-types give the impression that God sent Jesus as sort of an emergency measure. We imply (or worse yet, say outright) that God was conducting a kind of experiment with humanity and it was going so badly that merely giving instructions (like the ten commandments) and sending prophets to set us straight was insufficient and as a last resort God had to send Jesus. While you could certainly make a good case that the human race has a pretty long track record of breaking God's law and ignoring the prophets who rise up to challenge us with God's will, it would be a mistake to imagine that sending Jesus was some sort of emergency measure undertaken to correct a mistake.

From the very beginning of the human story – in the Garden of Eden – we've been in a love story with our Creator who has been reaching out to us in love. When our first human parents rebelled and turned away from God, that didn't create an emergency for God or change God's plan for us. Even while they were still hiding in their newly discovered nakedness, God came seeking their company in the cool of the evening (Genesis 3:8). God's disposition toward us has never changed. From this first image in scripture to the very end, God assures us that, "the dwelling place of God is among mortals." (Revelation 21:3)

As we enter the Advent season and anticipate Christmas, we celebrate God's unchanging will to dwell with us and to draw us into relationship. The Incarnation was not a last-ditch effort to correct a mistake, but the perfect expression of God's love toward us expressed in flesh and blood. We give thanks that Emmanuel (God with us) is not just an historical memory or an emergency measure undertaken once upon a time, but it is God's deepest desire and our living hope. My hope for us all is that we might allow ourselves to be found by the God who sought us out in the Garden, who came to us as a baby in Bethlehem, and who seeks us still through his living Spirit. Let God's love dwell within you and let God's light dispel the cold and dark of winter.


