





### **Church Council Highlights**

The Church Council's main focus over the past 2 months has been investing in St. Matthew's future. Specifically, improving the sound system in the sanctuary, repair of the parking lot, forming a Strategic Planning Committee for a 1, 3 & 5 year plan and determining an investment strategy for the church, cemetery and memorial funds are what we are working toward. Estimates for purchasing new microphones, repair of wiring, a new mixer and relocating antennas are underway. Cameras for the choir loft have been purchased so our Director of Music can have a view of the Sanctuary during services and will be installed soon. We have

reviewed an estimate to repair the parking lot and Buildings & Grounds Chair, Andy Federmann, is working on procuring another for comparison sake. Church clean up of the grounds and indoors will be Saturday, April 16<sup>th</sup>. The Council also appointed Paul Rich to replace Howard Rich on the Mission Committee through the 2016 term. Tom Schaner was voted as Chair by the Mission Committee.

#### **F.R.O.G.** (3 year olds - Kindergarteners)

Students learned ways to pray. They have a weekly bible story.

Students have been making unique bible bags to carry their bibles back and forth to church. In class they have also been focusing on knowing the books of the bible and The Beatitudes. Students talked about Lent and listened to The Easter Story on CD, which makes you feel you are right there with Jesus!

In class, students focus on prayer... having good weekly discussions about their daily teenage lives, in a safe setting.

#### **ADULT CLASS**

Another month has passed us by, giving people opportunities for Christian Education.

Well, we're raising St. Matthew's expectations for one another...

"Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy." - 1 Peter 2:10

Recently, I went to a Women of Faith Conference with a group of women from church. The speakers had a lot to say... but even more to show. You see, this was the end of their tour, the last tour for this awesome team of Christian women who for 20 years have come together, in the name of Christ, for you and I to learn from. They offered spiritual guidance, thoughts to ponder over, music and singing... combined with emotional gifts of their testimonies. I was so happy to have had this opportunity once again to see them; as well as bring my daughter and her fiancé along on this once-in-a-lifetime experience!

As I returned home with a bag of goodies: books, CD's, DVD's and notes I took over the 2 days, I thought about what are my "Christian expectations... as a Director of Christian Education, as a woman of faith and as a fellow church member"? We have all heard sometime in our lives that "knowledge is power." But have you been told what to do with it? I love this question. I love it because it reminds me that I am a people. *Today, we as a church need to raise our expectations!* 

They were stating how important we are together, everyone: ministers, fellow theologians and churchgoers, people in general. We are thought of ... like a people. Showing LOVE to one another! And that it is important that we begin, uncomfortably at times, with expectations. Being a people means others make claims on me; on my time, my resources, my heart. They expect me to pray for their father who was diagnosed with Alzheimer's. They expect me to be gracious when their kids act up in worship or Sunday school class. They expect me to bake cupcakes and/or volunteer for FoNP, or make soup for our Lent potluck and place my hard-earned cash in the collection plate. They expect me, most terrifyingly, to expect things of them; to need their care, concern, and casseroles. Us, as a people...this is what the Lord wants and expects as well!

Our Lord has died on the cross, taking away all our sins...He has risen! Now it's our time to rise. Rise up and be accountable. Let our people, His people, hold us to our expectations. God has given the right to each of us to expect us to join together as Disciples... Followers... Teachers... Leaders... Christians!

So start questioning yourselves... "What can I do more?"... "What are my gifts and talents?"... "Where is Jesus leading me?"... "And am I listening?" *Because YOU are worth it! Right where you are on your journey. You are more than good enough! You are His People!!* Yes! These are just the kinds of questions a people would ask!

Please join me in prayer, my church family, in gratitude to all God has done for us...

God, you have called us to be a people, your people. Help us figure out how.
