#### **Partners in Ministry**

According to the standard regulations governing pastors' clichéd newsletter articles, the calendar tells me I should offer several paragraphs on thankfulness. The resulting article should say all the same things about thankfulness that you have heard 1,000 times before. So let me cut to the chase: as Christians, we are generally in favor of thankfulness. In fact, if you cultivate the habit of being grateful for blessings instead of indulging in complaints about what's wrong you will be a happier person. Moreover, by focusing on what you can be thankful for in every day and in every circumstance, you may well get a deeper sense of God's goodness and love for you. You might even become a better disciple of Christ.

Whew! I'm glad I took care of that item on my to do list.

✓ Make appropriate noises about thankfulness in November newsletter.

Having said what I must, let me say what I really want to express: I am truly thankful for the welcome and love that Sandy and I have felt from St. Matthew's church. We felt that love keenly on October 14<sup>th</sup> when you called me to serve as your pastor and welcomed us both, not as guests, but as members of the family.

On the one hand, nothing has changed. We have been worshiping, working and witnessing together since I arrived a year ago. Our relationships have been established and we have grown in love and trust for one another. No matter how hard we have all tried to be on our best behavior, over the last year we have also observed moments of human frailty in one another. We know each other – the good, the bad and the indifferent.

On the other hand, we have entered into a totally new relationship. Couples who are courting don't change their feelings after they say 'I do,' but marriage changes their relationship. That's what is happening to us too. We have affirmed that we don't intend our relationship to be transitory and provisional, but committed. We have not merely struck a contract, but we have entered into a covenant. In a covenant, the parties who enter into it pledge themselves to the relationship. It is more than contractual promises of "I'll give you this if you give me that." It is a bond that holds even when there is (inevitable) sin and disappointment. It is a relationship like that which God has with us – love that will not let go.

Our commitment to each other (which we will enact liturgically in the service of installation) is the foundation upon which we will build our shared ministry. This covenantal commitment is the starting point from which we can grow our church spiritually, numerically and financially. We are mutually committed to this calling.

You didn't just call me. God called us. I'm truly thankful to share this high calling with you.




#### **Our Search for a New Pastor is Over**

Praise God for our Spiritual Life Committee in suggesting that classes be held during worship time. Thank you!



#### HOW TO GIVE TO ST. MATTHEW'S FROM YOUR IRA AND STILL RECEIVE A TAX BENEFIT

Persons over 70 1/2 who have an IRA, can continue to receive a tax benefit for a charitable contribution. This will give you the highlights but please consult your financial advisor, lawyer or IRA custodian to be sure that you accomplish the transfer properly and that it will benefit your specific situation.

- 1. As you should know, you must take a distribution from your IRA after you attain the age of 70 1/2. This is called the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD).
- 2. If you have other income or can spare some of the funds from the RMD, you can direct your IRA to send funds directly to St. Matthew's or any charity.

#### What is the benefit to you?

- 1. The amount donated to the charity counts as part of the mandatory RMD withdrawal which you must take every year.
- 2. The amount donated is not reportable as income to you so your Adjusted Gross Income is reduced by the amount of the donation.
- 3. Your tax liability is reduced because your Adjusted Gross Income is less than it would have been if you had received the funds directly as a part of your RMD.
- 4. Your Medicare premiums could be reduced as they are based upon your Adjusted Gross Income.

The funds MUST be sent directly to the charity. They cannot be sent to you and then redirected by you to the charity. This is easy to accomplish.


