We're Having an Epiphany

I don't think I've ever met anyone who actually said, "I've had an epiphany." Your average person doesn't talk like that — even in church — for which I suppose we should all be grateful. Nevertheless, if someone did say it, we'd know what they meant. They would mean that they had a breakthrough, that things which were foggy and obscure had become clear. We would know that they had a fresh insight into something, that they had seen the light, come to a more profound understanding. Epiphany means an unveiling — a manifestation or revelation of something. When we speak of Epiphany with a capital "E" we mean the unveiling or open manifestation of God in Jesus.

The season of Epiphany began on January 6 (The Feast of the Epiphany) when we recall that Jesus was revealed as the gift to the nations, even as representatives of the nations brought gifts to him. When Jesus received baptism at the hands of John, he was revealed as the beloved Son of God as he was simultaneously revealed to be united with us in our humanity. Jesus is revealed as Lord of creation and as the source of joy as he changes water to wine at a wedding in Cana. Jesus reveals himself as the fulfilment of the messianic hope of Israel's prophets at his first sermon in Nazareth. Jesus' acts of healing and liberating people from the bondage to evil will continue throughout the season of Epiphany. The last Sunday of Epiphany is the Feast of the Transfiguration in which Jesus is revealed to his most intimate disciples as the culmination of the Law and the Prophets – as God's authoritative Word to the world.

We should go through the season of Epiphany with our eyes open to the nature and character of God revealed in Jesus. We can remember his love for all nations and people; his human nature that experienced life in exactly the same way we do; his teaching and preaching that call us to right living and acting justly. We see God's sovereignty over nature and God's loving purposes for humanity in Jesus' miracles and acts of healing. Every time Jesus casts out demons we are reassured that evil cannot conquer the saving will of God.

All this is proper for our spiritual growth throughout Epiphany, but we cannot forget our role in God's continuing self-manifestation to the whole world. As you walk through this season of Epiphany, ask yourself: "What am I doing to show that God's love extends to all people?" With nationalism and tribalism on the rise everywhere, what will you say and do to demonstrate the universal love of God that recognizes no tribe or nation? Does your contentment with life demonstrate that in Jesus you have found the answer for human longing? How is our church a manifestation of the welcoming, gracious, forgiving, and transforming love of God? If you're like me, when you think of these questions you know you could do better. We shouldn't use this self-examination to condemn ourselves or others, but to crack open our hard shells so we can grow.

As you walk through these days of Epiphany, you might begin your day with a simple prayer: "Light of the world, shine through me today and reveal your love to those I encounter. Amen."

World Day of Prayer


