Full-Time Christian Service

As soon as the weather turns from dismal to delightful, all God's children fire up their lawnmowers and put on their gloves to dig up weeds, to rake out the debris of the winter's sleep and to restore our lawns and gardens to some semblance of order. Naturally, just when you have a day to tackle your yard work, you are accosted in church to surrender a good chunk of that precious Spring weather to yard cleanup at church. I get it. I have a yard (or two) myself.

On my way to church, I think how I really need to be working at home. Once I get there and see everyone happily pitching in, I forget about the work that waits at home and I celebrate again the way God's people use their talent and time, their treasure and strength, to give glory to God and to accomplish God's purposes.

Enumerating the work people do is fraught with the danger of forgetting some precious gift of love offered by a willing heart, so I won't name names. We know that we couldn't accomplish the mission and ministry of the church without many willing hands and hearts: those who teach our children and tend our babies; those who keep the building and grounds in good repair; those whose voices sing praise and whose hands are skilled to make music; those who administer our office and finances and who organize our fellowship; those who cook and serve the bereaved and the homeless poor; those who visit and comfort and counsel the ones who are lonely and in need. When Paul speaks of the church as a body, with every part an essential contributor to the whole, this is the sort of thing he means. No one is extraneous. All are necessary. Each gift of time and love is crucial and indispensable.

When I felt God's call to ministry and switched my major to religious studies in college, I learned a term I had never heard before: 'full-time Christian service.' It was a polite churchy way of saying that some church or religious organization paid your salary. It always had a nails-on-the-chalkboard sort of feeling to me. It implied that 'church professionals' were in 'full-time Christian service' while the rest of God's people were what, part-timers? I don't think so.

The ministry of God's people is not part time and it is not confined to the volunteer service to the church or to mission agencies either. The ministry of God's people is not a job to help the church function, even though the church would collapse without its volunteer ministries. Your ministry and mine is 24/7/365 if we really follow our vocation as Christians, and most of it is not done at church. You are doing full-time Christian service when you keep the books, or take vitals, or frame up a wall. You do full-time Christian service when you answer phones and book appointments, when you calm customers and make sales. You are serving Christ when you are cramped into a coach seat on a red-eye flight, when you order supplies or write code, when you set up a firewall or bake a cake. You are doing full time Christian service after hours too. When you pay attention to your spouse or guide a child. When you take a moment for a neighbor who needs to talk. When you laugh, and eat, and drink, and make love, this is your full-time Christian service.

This vocation – this calling – of being a child of God is not a Sunday thing or a church thing. It is not so much what we do, but how we do it. It is not where we are but always remembering whose we are. As disciples of Christ, we are all called to full-time Christian service.

"Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each man should give what he has decided to give in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." 2 Corinthians 9: 6-7

I invite you to ponder this insight from St. Paul during the month of May, when many of us are planting. I've yet to meet a gardener who is anything less than cheerful. It seems planting something—be it a zinnia or a tomato — plants a seed of hope within the gardener.

Stinginess comes from a place of fear; fear that there will not be enough. This fear insults God who can and will provide, and do so abundantly. Like spoiled children who always want more and more and more, our focus on ourselves and lack of giving to others only serves to perpetuate our unhappiness. Instead, plant generously; give freely and cheerfully, which opens our hearts and lives to God's abundant blessings.
