

Lent Habits

The season of Lent will soon be upon us. In the "olden days," when I was growing up, the stress was more on a somber time of year, with services each Wednesday of Lent, beginning, of course, with Ash Wednesday. Our church did not offer the ashes but they had communion on that Holy Day and then stressed giving up things the rest of the season to help us get closer to God and remember the sacrifice of Jesus. Holy Week was filled with services most of the week, until the glorious celebration of Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday.

For many years now, the emphasis has changed, to not be so somber and penitent. However, just as a discipline, I still give up chocolate for Lent each year. Let me say, the first few years, because I love anything and everything chocolate, it was very hard and I had to calm myself and ask God for strength throughout Lent.

Now, after over 25 years, it is second nature to me, and now what I do is something different along with giving up the chocolate.

And that is what I would challenge you to do this Lenten season. Instead of giving up something for Lent, TAKE SOMETHING ON.

What do I mean by that?

Simple: It is what our Lord Jesus asks of us...reach out and help; reach out and see; reach out and respond. Reach out and be the light in someone's life, like Jesus is in your life.

Here are a few examples where you can reach out and be that light:

- 1. Drop a short note to people who know who are homebound or need an extra lift.
- 2. Make a list of people to pray for during Lent and then let them know you did.
- 3. Smile at the stranger you pass on the street.
- 4. Say Hello to the people you pass on the way into or out of a store
- 5. Send an extra check (it doesn't have to be much; it's the thought that counts!) to your favorite charity.
- 6. Pay for the person/car behind you in the coffee shop line (tell the cashier at the window you are also paying for the car behind you).
- 7. Take a bag full of canned goods to your local food pantry.
- 8. Pay for a family, when you are out to eat, perhaps sitting near you, but do it secretly.
- 9. Tell someone you love them (or a lot of some ones!)
- 10. Read stories to your special little ones and give them an extra hug when they ask you to read it again!

You get my drift and you can make up your own list and don't forget to come to worship as you can during this holy season:
